This learned work on Hindu traditions of religions heremeneutics by Professor Oberhammer deals with some problems in the Āgama texts—Mṛgendrāgama (1.1.1-29), Paramasaṃhitā (1.1.1.-69), Jayākhyasaṃhitā (1.1.1-79, II.1-30), Pādmasaṃhitā (1.1.1-116, 1.2.1-21) and Kauṇḍinya's Pañcārtha bhāṣya. German translation of the texts is given as Appendix. The Vedā-s are considered apauruṣeya and infallible, hence transcendental; hermeneutic method has to be used; but the Āgama-s, though authoritative, are not considered apauruṣeya. The Mimāmsā hermeneutic approach towards Vedic texts cannot be applied to the Āgama-s in the same way. Even the texts are not as fixed as that of the Veda. Pāṭhāntara, adhikapāṭha etc. can be seen in the Āgama texts. The problems that confront the Āgama exigets are more complex than those that the Vedic interpreters have to face.

'Praņastapāthavākyānām krtvā vastuvicāraņam tajjnaih saha prayatnād vai hyāgamam samskaroti yah'.

The problem of transmission of the texts from teacher to student without interruption is discussed. This is an interesting and scholarly work.
